Mr Gallagher and Mrs Dixon led interviews for these very important roles on Monday afternoon.


All candidates from Year Six who were interviewed were excellent and very well prepared.

The choice was incredibly difficult but we are pleased to announce that this year's Head Boy is Kai S and Head Girl is Maiya L.



Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Forgiving God, so often we get distracted by things and are too busy to put you first. Yet you never stop loving us, and so we thank you for never giving up on us.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus tells us three stories to show us how God welcomes us, loves us and forgives us all.

In the reading we hear, how the shepherd was so concerned when he lost one sheep out of a hundred?
And how the woman was so worried about losing one coin out of ten?

Even though it was only one sheep or one coin, they were still very important and valuable to the people who had lost them.

Jesus is our shepherd, and we, his followers, are the sheep.

In the same way as in the stories, all people are valuable to God, because God made us and loves us. We are all different. We are all special. God cares for us and loves us. God wants us to do what is right. But sometimes we do not listen, we are not very generous, and we can be mean to others. At these times we're a bit like the sheep or the coin that is lost, because we are turning away from God.

But this doesn't mean that God loves and cares for us any less. God cares for us and watches over us always. And when we see that we have done something wrong, when we ask for forgiveness and turn back to God, He is happy and welcomes us back and celebrates because we are no longer lost.

In Jesus's last story we hear about a father's forgiveness for his son. Although the son went far away and wasted the father's money, he realised he had done something wrong and he came back to his father, saying sorry.



We should try to make sure that everyone feels welcome. We can try to recognise everyone's special gifts and talents and help everyone to feel safe and happy.

God of lost sheep, coins and all people, help us to remember you are with us in love and forgiveness every day. Guide us to share your love with others through all that we do. Amen.
