

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Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God of justice and wisdom, help us to keep on praying and never to doubt that you will be with us always. In this Sunday's gospel we hear about a bad judge and a widow who would not give up. And how Jesus teaches us the importance of justice, of praying and of never giving up hope.

Judges were supposed to be fair and honest, but this wasn't always the case. The prophets in the Bible were always getting angry with bad judges who thought more about themselves than about the people who had been hurt by someone else's actions. And if the judges didn't sort out the problems fairly then people would suffer again and again.

The widow was ignored by the law but she didn't give up. She just kept asking the judge to make things right. Eventually, just to get rid of her, he gave her what she wanted, justice. Her prayers were finally answered.

By telling this story, Jesus wanted us to understand that the widow is like us - we call to God in our prayers to give us what we need and want.

Jesus said that God hears the cries of all who call out to him day and night. And God will certainly answer our prayers, even if it's not in the way that we expect.



There are many things that are unfair in our world. And there are many people, like the widow in the story, who struggle to make their voices heard.

We can pray for these people but we also have to do what we can to make sure all people are treated fairly.

This week think about how you can treat other people and our world fairly and justly. What will you do to help others know that you care?

God who always hears us, help us to make a change when we see something that is not right in our world. May we find strength to keep going, even if at first we are not heard.
