This week's Sports Star of the Week is Dewa H in Year 5 for good work rate and team work in gymnastics.








Year 2 children were visited by Julie and the cuddly caped crusader Safety Seymour on Monday, they taught Year 2 all about carbon monoxide.

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

God of light, shine in our hearts so that we can bring joy and hope to other people, especially those who are frightened, sick, lonely or hungry.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus heard that John had been put in prison. In response, he went away to Galilee and went to live in Capernaum, a town by Lake Galilee, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali. This was done to make what the prophet Isaiah had said come true:

"Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali,

on the road to the sea, on the other side of the Jordan, Galilee, land of the Gentiles! The people who live in darkness will see a great light. On those who live in the dark land of death the light will shine."

From that time Jesus began to preach his message: "Turn away from your sins, because the Kingdom of heaven is near."

This story talks about people who lived in darkness seeing a great light. One way of thinking about this is that when we are sad or lonely, everything feels dark and gloomy. This is the dark. But then when someone does something nice for us, like including us in their game or making us laugh, everything seems brighter again. This is the light. This is the light that Jesus brings into the world.



We all live in one world, with the same sun shining down on us. We are all God's children and belong to one family. Jesus asks us to look after each other. If we do this, we can help the light of Jesus to shine in the world.

God of hope, share your light with all your children, as we try to help others who are in need.
