Second Sunday of Lent - The Transfiguration

God of light and power, you sent your Son Jesus to show us how to live our lives. Help us to recognise him in all people that we meet and to take action so that the lives of all people may change for the better.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear about something very special that happened to Jesus while he was on a mountain with three of his friends. His appearance changed as his face and clothes shone like the sun.

This also changed the lives of his friends as they realised that Jesus was the Son of God.

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

Six days later Jesus took with him, Peter and the brothers James and John and led them up a high mountain where they were alone. As they looked on, a change came over Jesus: his face was shining like the sun, and his clothes were dazzling white. Then the three disciples saw Moses and Elijah talking with Jesus. So Peter spoke up and said to Jesus, "Lord, how good it is that we are here! If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

While he was talking, a shining cloud came over them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased—listen to him!"

When the disciples heard the voice, they were so terrified that they threw themselves face downwards on the ground. Jesus came to them and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid!" So they looked up and saw no one there but Jesus.

As they came down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Don't tell anyone about this vision you have seen until the Son of Man has been raised from death."



The disciples were very afraid but Jesus re-assured them not to be and eventually everything looked normal again, however the disciples' lives were changed by what happened on the mountain. They now knew just how special Jesus really was – that he was God's Son. Our lives are changed by Jesus too as He lives in all of us. Jesus shows us how we should live our lives. He asks us to always try to do what is right, to stand up for what we believe in and to help other people.

God of love, help us to be like your Son, and make a real difference to the lives of our global family. Amen.
