Thursday was designated 'Art Day' here at St John's, all years had a wonderful time spending the day getting messy whilst creating fantastic pieces of art!






Early Years really had so much fun today being artists! We looked at 'Starry Night' by Vincent Van Gogh, the children used mixed media to make their versions of the painting.




Children born between 1 September 2016 - 31 August 2017 start full time school in September 2021.

First Sunday of Advent

God of love, you sent your Son Jesus into the world to show us how to live. Help us to be ready for when he comes again

This Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent – a special time when we get ready for the coming of Jesus.

Jesus asks us all to keep watch for him so that we will be ready when he comes.

Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

Jesus said, "Be on watch, be alert, for you do not know when the time will come. It will be like a man who goes away from home on a journey and leaves his servants in charge, after giving to each one his own work to do and after telling the doorkeeper to keep watch. Be on guard, then, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming — it might be in the evening or at midnight or before dawn or at sunrise. If he comes suddenly, he must not find you asleep. What I say to you, then, I say to all: watch

Jesus promised us that one day he would return. In this gospel story Jesus is telling us that we must be ready when he comes again, but that we cannot be exactly sure when that will be.

Advent is a time when we especially think about getting ready to welcome Jesus, when we remember his birth at Christmas and when he comes again in glory. In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus asks us to look out and keep our eyes open for what is happening around us, so that we are ready when he comes.



How will you make sure you are ready for Jesus when he comes again?

Living God, help us to listen to your word, to be kind and generous and helpful to others and to be ready to welcome Jesus when he comes.
