

Second Sunday of Advent

God of truth, help us to prepare for the coming of your Son and to share the message of your love with others.

In this Sunday's gospel we hear about how our school patron, John the Baptist, prepared people for the coming of Jesus by baptising them. How do we prepare for the coming of Jesus at Christmas?

Gospel: Mark 1:1-8

This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It began as the prophet Isaiah had written:

"God said, 'I will send my messenger ahead of you to clear the way for you.'
Someone is shouting in the desert,
'Get the road ready for the Lord;
make a straight path for him to trave!!'"

So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. "Turn away from your sins and be baptized," he told the people, "and God will forgive your sins." Many people from the province of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to hear John. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the River Jordan.


John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. He announced to the people, "The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and untie his sandals. I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In this reading we hear about John the Baptist and how he was a messenger for God, preparing people for the coming of Jesus. When John began to prepare the way for Jesus, it wasn't just for his friends and family. His message was for everyone who would listen.

We still follow his message today through our school mission statement:

'We will prepare the way by loving, living and learning with the Lord.'

Everything we do at St John's is to ensure we all use our faith, skills and talents to prepare the way for the second coming and to prepare for the successful life that God intends for us.



Generous God, as we prepare for the coming of your Son Jesus, help us to remember all our brothers and sisters in our global family and to share your love with them. Amen
