

The Most Holy Trinity

God of all, fill us with your Spirit of love and peace and help us to spread your word and to show our faith by how we treat each other. We ask this through Christ, your Son, who is with us always.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear how Jesus sent out his disciples to spread his word. And Jesus tells us that he will always be with us.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples went to the hill in Galilee where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him, even though some of them doubted. Jesus drew near and said to them, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age."

Sometime after his death and resurrection Jesus appeared to the disciples and he had a very special task for them. He asked them to spread his word and to teach people to follow his commandments.

Jesus asks us to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves. His words weren't just for his disciples – they were for all of us. St Francis of Assisi said, "Preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary use words." What do you think this means?



At the end of the reading, Jesus said, "I am with you always, yes to the end of time." How does it make you feel to know that Jesus is always with us?

What will you do this week to share Jesus's word with others through your actions?

Christ Jesus, you are always with us. May we show love for our neighbour, treating all people as we would wish to be treated. And through what we do, may others see that we believe in you. Amen.
