




These events will be attended by a range of professionals including School representatives, Solihull Inclusion Support Service, Educational Psychology, School Transport, Travel Training, College representative, Education and Skills, StART Team representatives and health and social care representatives.

This is a chance to find out how transitions should work, what schools and professionals can do to help, and for you to be able to ask questions around this.



Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God of love, help us to recognise the importance of all children no matter where in the world they come from.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear how Jesus valued children and thought they were important. Let's think about how important all children around the world are today.

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

Jesus and his disciples left that place and went on through Galilee. Jesus did not want anyone to know where he was, because he was teaching his disciples: "The Son of Man will be handed over to those who will kill him. Three days later, however, he will rise to life."

But they did not understand what this teaching meant, and they were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and after going indoors Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you arguing about on the road?"

But they would not answer him, because on the road they had been arguing among themselves about who was the greatest. Jesus sat down, called the twelve disciples, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must place himself last of all and be the servant of all." Then he took a child and had him stand in front of them. He put his arms around him and said to them, "Whoever welcomes in my name one of these children, welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me, welcomes not only me but also the one who sent me."

In this gospel reading, Jesus shows the disciples how important children are. He says that anyone who welcomes a child, welcomes him.

Jesus is in all of us. No matter who we are, where we come from, whether we are rich or poor, old or young. Even the youngest person is special and important because they are loved by God.

Children around the world are different. But each one of them is special and important.



What will you do this week to show that all people are important no matter who they are?

God of hope, we know that all people are important, because they are loved by you. Show us how to help others to see this too, so that the world can be a fairer place for all your children. Amen.
