

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Loving God, your Son Jesus shows us that all people, including little children, are important and loved by you.

Help us to follow his example and to respect and care for all people around the world.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear how special and important children were to Jesus

Gospel: Mark 10: -13-16

Some people brought children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples scolded the people. When Jesus noticed this, he was angry and said to his disciples, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, because the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I assure you that whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it." Then he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on each of them, and blessed them.

People were bringing their children to Jesus for his blessing, but the disciples tried to stop them. Perhaps they thought the children would bother Jesus, that he would find them too loud or lively. Or maybe the disciples were worried that Jesus was tired or hungry and that it was time for him to rest.

However, Jesus was angry and told the disciples to let the children come to him. He said that the kingdom of God belonged to children like these. He said that they have a special way of looking at the world and of understanding things, which adults can learn from.

Jesus welcomed and blessed the children who came to see him. He loves us all. No matter where in the world we live. Whether we are old or young, big or small, rich or poor.



God of love, you teach us to see that the world is good. Help us to care for creation and to love our sisters and brothers. Amen.
