



Covid Update

You will be aware that we have experienced a minor outbreak of Covid cases within school this week. This is completely in line with the current, recent rise of infection rates in our local area. However, to re-assure you, I'm sharing the additional measures that we have put back in place in order to reduce the likelihood of any further cross-infection within school.

As soon as we met the advised threshold for Covid cases we:

- Re-instated the 'bubble' system for years 3, 4, 5 and 6, meaning they will remain separate during break and lunchtimes.
- Ensured enhanced cleaning routines are in place, including the regular cleaning of touch points
- Staff have been asked to wear face coverings in busy areas or if they need to work across more than one bubble or year group.

All assemblies and planned parent meetings will now be virtual again, until cases drop significantly.

Our swift response has been praised by Public Health England, so let's hope that we can return back to normal routines as quickly as possible.

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Servant God, show us how we can help others, so that all members of our global family can live free from hunger and poverty.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus reminds us that it is not power or money which makes us important, but how much we help other people.

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "there is something we want you to do for us."

"What is it?" Jesus asked them.

They answered, "When you sit on your throne in your glorious Kingdom, we want you to let us sit with you, one at your right and one at your left."

Jesus said to them, "You don't know what you are asking for. Can you drink the cup of suffering that I must drink? Can you be baptised in the way I must be baptized?"


"We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink the cup I must drink and be baptised in the way I must be baptized. But I do not have the right to choose who will sit at my right and my left. It is God who will give these places to those for whom he has prepared them."

When the other ten disciples heard about it, they became angry with James and John. So Jesus called them all together to him and said, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the heathen have power over them, and the leaders have complete authority. This, however, is not the way it is among you. If one of you wants to be great, he must be the servant of the rest; and if one of you wants to be first, he must be the slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served; he came to serve and to give his life to redeem many people.

James and John asked to sit by Jesus' side in heaven, but Jesus said he was not able to give them these seats. The other disciples started to get cross with James and John. They felt that they were showing off and that they thought they were the best and most important disciples.

Jesus said that the greatest disciple was not the one who went around showing off his power, or money, or things. But rather that the greatest disciple must be like a servant – humble and helping others in all that they do. Choose one action, next week, that helps someone close to you – to show you too are a disciple of Christ.



God of hope, encourage us to reach out when we see people who need our help. Open our hearts so that we may work together to make the world a fairer place for all people. Amen.
