Year 3 had a great afternoon in Science learning about mirror reflections. We tested out the notion that a mirror reflection is a reversed image and we challenged each other to walk along a line looking up through the mirror reflection, it was so much fun but challenging!





This week, Year 4 have taken inspiration from Matisse's 'Les Codomas', We have been 'painting with scissors' as Matisse did in his later years and have created amazing pieces of art!







Year 5 have been busy as usual. We have enjoyed a fantastic novel called The Savage and created our own savage drawings. In music, we are starting to perform patterns using stell drums (which are very loud) and in History we are learning about the French Revolution including Marie-Antoinette, Napoleon and King Louis demanding money from his people. Finally, for Art, we have looked at some Islamic patterns and created our own.

Year 6 are enjoying their OAA PE Unit, where they are using effective communication (Heart Skills) to work as a team. After each game they played, the children had an opportunity to assess, reflect and evaluate their performance by using their Head Skills. Our fantastic sports leaders, Grace P and Brogan, developed their leadership skills by leading some activities during the lesson - super coaching!




Sports Star of the Week

Excellent Work



Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Loving God, you sent your Son Jesus to share the good news of your love for everyone. May we also share this good news through our words and all that we do.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear Jesus telling people what it is he has come to do. One of the things he says is that he has come to bring good news to people who are poor. Our faith calls us to do the same.

Gospel: Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Dear Theophilus:

Many people have done their best to write a report of the things that have taken place among us. They wrote what we have been told by those who saw these things from the beginning and who proclaimed the message. And so, Your Excellency, because I have carefully studied all these matters from their beginning, I thought it would be good to write an orderly account for you. I do this so that you will know the full truth about everything which you have been taught.

Then Jesus returned to Galilee, and the power of the Holy Spirit was with him. The news about him spread throughout all that territory. He taught in the synagogues and was praised by everyone.

Then Jesus went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath he went as usual to the synagogue. He stood up to read the Scriptures and was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it is written,

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has chosen me to bring good news to the poor.
He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives
and recovery of sight to the blind,
to set free the oppressed
and announce that the time has come
when the Lord will save his people."

Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. All the people in the synagogue had their eyes fixed on him, as he said to them, "This passage of scripture has come true today, as you heard it being read."

Jesus is teaching in the synagogue. He reads a passage from the Scriptures which is about himself (although the people listening don't know that until he explains it afterwards). The Scripture passage talks about what Jesus has been sent to do. It says that he has come to bring good news to people who are poor.

Good news means different things to different people. It can be confidence, peace, enough food, light in the darkness, doing well at school, getting to spend the day with friends.

We are all God's children. God loves us all. No matter where in the world we are, whether we are rich or poor, and we should all have the chance to live in a world of peace, dignity and fairness. This is the good news of Jesus.



God of life, you call us all to share your good news. May we do all that we can to answer that call. We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.
