


Ash Wednesday, this week, marked the beginning of Lent. However, for our school community it marked a special return to further normality.

Intentional in the way we live and use the resources of the earth, guided by conscience; and prophetic in the example we set for others.



As ever, we will be supporting our children's understanding of these virtues through our assemblies and class collective worship and celebrating those who 'live' these virtues through our weekly virtues awards.


Mr G's Recommended Reads






World Book Day!

We listened to many wonderful stories from Matilda and her friends to authors of popular books.


The children created their own book cover for their favourite book or for a new story.

Then we enjoyed "The Incredible Story" digital broadcast which was interactive and gave us lots of writing ideas.


Finally, we created our own origami bookmarks based on a book or character.

First Sunday of Lent

God of life, your Son Jesus went out into the desert to spend time in prayer and be closer to you. Help us to draw closer to you this Lent, in our prayers and in our actions.

In this Sunday's gospel we hear about how Jesus spent 40 days praying in the desert, to get closer to God, and to get ready for his ministry. At the end of this time he was very hungry.

Gospel: Luke 4:1-13

Jesus returned from the Jordan full of the Holy Spirit and was led by the Spirit into the desert, where he was tempted by the Devil for forty days. In all that time he ate nothing, so that he was hungry when it was over.

The Devil said to him, "If you are God's Son, order this stone to turn into bread." But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Human beings cannot live on bread alone.'"

Then the Devil took him up and showed him in a second all the kingdoms of the world. "I will give you all this power and all this wealth," the Devil told him. "It has all been handed over to me, and I can give it to anyone I choose. All this will be yours, then, if you worship me." Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him!"

Then the Devil took him to Jerusalem and set him on the highest point of the Temple, and said to him, "If you are God's Son, throw yourself down from here. For the scripture says, 'God will order his angels to take good care of you.' It also says, 'They will hold you up with their hands so that not even your feet will be hurt on the stones.'" But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

When the Devil finished tempting Jesus in every way, he left him for a while.

Jesus went out into the desert for 40 days to be alone and to pray. He went to draw closer to God, to listen to what God was asking him to do and to find strength for his work of spreading the good news.

This weekend sees the first Sunday of Lent. Lent is a time when we try to be a bit like Jesus in the desert. We spend 40 days trying to come closer to God, so that we are ready for Easter. We try to pray more and share more. We try to think less about ourselves and more about other people – our neighbours at home and around the world.

We can be closer to God by praying, by asking for forgiveness for all the things that we have done wrong, and by trying to live the kind of life God wants us to. We can share with and care for others who need our help.



How will you pray more and share more this Lent?

Loving God, we thank and praise you for all the gifts that you have given us. But in a world of plenty too many people go hungry. We pray that you may work through us, so our small acts of love make a big difference and everyone may have enough to eat. Amen.
