
'Through the Mirror Door' by Sarah Baker

<u>Second Sunday of Lent – The Transfiguration</u>

God of light, you sent your Son Jesus to show us how to live. Help us to make a change in our world, so that all people may live free from poverty and hunger.

In this Sunday's gospel we hear about an amazing thing that happened to Jesus, which showed the disciples just how important he was. A great change came over him...

Gospel: Luke 9:28-36

Jesus took Peter, John, and James with him and went up a hill to pray. While he was praying, his face changed its appearance, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly two men were there talking with him. They were Moses and Elijah, who appeared in heavenly glory and talked with Jesus about the way in which he would soon fulfill God's purpose by dying in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were sound asleep, but they woke up and saw Jesus' glory and the two men who were standing with him. As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, how good it is that we are here! We will make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." (He did not really know what he was saying.)

While he was still speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them with its shadow; and the disciples were afraid as the cloud came over them. A voice said from the cloud, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen — listen to him!"

When the voice stopped, there was Jesus all alone. The disciples kept quiet about all this and told no one at that time anything they had seen.

Jesus is changed. And everything now changes for the disciples too. After all, they know now that Jesus really is the Son of God.

Through our prayers this Lent we can hope for wonderful changes too. We can ask God to help us to act differently, to make the world a fairer place, and to treat others as we would wish to be treated.

The disciples thought perhaps they should stay on the mountain and worship Jesus, but Jesus took them back down. Our Christian life is mostly lived among people who need us to show God's love. Our faith is not something just for church, but it is something that we have to live out every day in all that we do.



What will you do to try and live more as God asks you to? How will you listen and change your life and the lives of others for the better?

God our Father, help us to see your Son in all people and to treat them as we would wish to be treated ourselves. Help us to listen and to live our lives as you ask us to. Amen.
