We always have grand plans and ambitious ideas at St John's but forming a whole school rainbow, to represent the colour of the flag of Ukraine, has been one of our biggest (and most challenging!) The weather was certainly against us as the wind blew strongly and rain threatened. However, we just about managed to achieve our goal. A huge thank you to Coach Steve, who came in specially to help us and risked his drone being blown away or from



suffering a crash landing, due to the winds. Thank you also for sending your child into school wearing the correct colours.

Our final result isn't perfect but it does what it was intended to do and sends a powerful, whole school community message of love and support to all those effected by this terrible war. Through our Lenten fundraising we have raised £523.19! which we will be donating to the Ukraine cause. We would like to thank our St John's community for their amazing generosity.






Our Pope's Prayer Intentions




Week 7 of our Lent family activities.




Year 1 has been drawing animals and labelling them with scientific vocabulary.







Palm Sunday

Eternal God, may we always welcome Jesus into our hearts with joy. Help us to see Christ in all people and to make them feel welcome. We make this prayer to you through Christ our Lord.

This Sunday is called Palm Sunday, when we remember the time when Jesus entered Jerusalem.

Gospel: Luke 19:28-40

After Jesus said this, he went on ahead of them to Jerusalem. As he came near Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, he sent two disciples ahead with these instructions: "Go to the village there ahead of you; as you go in, you will find a colt tied up that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If someone asks you why you are untying it, tell him that the Master needs it."

They went on their way and found everything just as Jesus had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying it?"

"The Master needs it," they answered, and they took the colt to Jesus. Then they threw their cloaks over the animal and helped Jesus get on. As he rode on, people spread their cloaks on the road.

When he came near Jerusalem, at the place where the road went down the Mount of Olives, the large crowd of his disciples began to thank God and praise him in loud voices for all the great things that they had seen: "God bless the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory to God!"

Then some of the Pharisees in the crowd spoke to Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "command your disciples to be quiet!" Jesus answered, "I tell you that if they keep quiet, the stones themselves will start shouting."

Sunday is a special day, the start of Holy Week, when we hear two readings from Saint Luke's Gospel. The second one is called the Passion and tells the story of how Jesus was arrested, tried, crucified, died and was buried.

In the reading above we heard how Jesus sent the disciples off to borrow a donkey, and to say that, "The Master needs it", if they were asked where they were taking it.

Then Jesus entered into Jerusalem on this donkey, while the people shouted their praises to God. What a welcome this must have been.

Jesus is in all of us, so every time we meet someone and welcome them, we are welcoming Jesus. We are asked by God to treat all people as we would like to be treated.



So, during Holy Week think about how you can make all the people you spend time with at home and elsewhere feel welcome

Christ Jesus, open our hearts so we may sing your praise. Help us to welcome you into our lives, and to see you in all our brothers and sisters throughout the world. Amen.
