






Making patterns, sorting objects by initial sound and building sandcastles. Our prayer service was about God



Mr G's Recommended Reads

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
For our younger readers...

Fifth Sunday of Easter

God of hope, you sent your Son Jesus to teach us how to love one another. Help us to follow his example and to love all our brothers and sisters around the world.

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus has a very important message for his disciples, and for all who believe in him. He asks us to love one another as he loves us.

Gospel: John 13:31-35

After Judas had left, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man's glory is revealed; now God's glory is revealed through him. And if God's glory is revealed through him, then God will reveal the glory of the Son of Man in himself, and he will do so at once. My children, I shall not be with you very much longer. You will look for me; but I tell you now what I told the Jewish authorities, 'You cannot go where I am going.' And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples."

Jesus tells his disciples that he will not be with them for much longer and he tells them how he'd like them to behave. Can you remember what he told them to do?

Jesus told the disciples to love one another, just as he had loved them. He spent time with people, especially those who were sick, lonely, frightened or poor. He listened to them and ate with them. He healed them and he helped them to change their lives for the better. His message to love other people wasn't just for his disciples but for everyone in the world, then and still today.



What will you do to show your love for others this week?

Loving God, fill us with your love and help us to share this love with others, especially with those who are poor, sick, lonely or frightened.
