

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Dear God, help us to make our world a peaceful place so that all people can live free from the fear of fighting and war. We ask this through Christ our Lord and Prince of Peace

In today's gospel, Jesus gives the disciples a very special gift – the gift of peace.

Gospel: John 14:23-29

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and my Father and I will come to him and live with him. Whoever does not love me does not obey my teaching. And the teaching you have heard is not mine, but comes from the Father, who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am still with you. The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and make you remember all that I have told you.

"Peace is what I leave with you; it is my own peace that I give you. I do not give it as the world does. Do not be worried and upset; do not be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I am leaving, but I will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father; for he is greater than I. I have told you this now before it all happens, so that when it does happen, you will believe."

Jesus gave his disciples a very special gift – the gift of peace - and he told them not to be afraid. This gospel and its message is particularly relevant and important today as we see the horror of war in Ukraine. Let's hope that the peace that Jesus left for his followers, influences those who bring war and helps them to seek a peaceful solution to their conflict.

Let's also hope that the people of Ukraine are comforted by the love of Christ and hold faith that the peace of Jesus will one day return to their country.



In our own lives, we have arguments and fall outs so we too can try to behave in a way that brings peace. We can look for ways to resolve our small conflicts and contribute to making the world a happier place.

Living God, may we bring the light of your peace to those we meet. Help us to find a peaceful way to solve our problems, so that the world may be a safer place for everyone to live in.
