

Florence

The capital of Italy's Tuscan region. Michelangelo's home city

Medici

An important Italian family, who were bankers and lived in Florence during the renaissance

Guild

An organisation made up of a group of craftsmen

Duomo

Italian word for cathedral

Basilica

A name given by the Pope to some churches

Pope

The head of the Roman Catholic church

**Vatican City** 

Headquarters of the Roman Catholic church and home to the Pope. Surrounded by the city of Rome (capital of Italy)

Linear perspective The way lines and shapes are used to show three-dimensional space in a two-dimensional work of art

Carve

The act of using tools to shape something from a material by scraping away

Cast

A way of making a sculpture by pouring liquid, for example liquid metal, into a mould

Where sculptures are carved or **built all around**, from front to back

In the round

Where sculptures **stick out from a flat surface**, rather than being made all the way around

In relief

Flat relief


Where relief sculpture is **particularly flat** – not very much raised from the surface

Contrapposto

An Italian word used to describe a standing human figure where the weight is placed on one leg causing the head, shoulders and body to twist


