



The Most Holy Trinity

God of love, you gave us your Son, you gave us your Spirit, may we always follow you in all that we do and say.

This weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday when we think about how God is made up of three persons: God the Father, Jesus Christ, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have much more to tell you, but now it would be too much for you to bear. When, however, the Spirit comes, who reveals the truth about God, he will lead you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own authority, but he will speak of what he hears and will tell you of things to come. He will give me glory, because he will take what I say and tell it to you. All that my Father has is mine; that is why I said that the Spirit will take what I give him and tell it to you."

This story is part of Jesus' farewell conversation to the disciples before he dies on the cross. He tells the disciples that after he has gone, the Holy Spirit will guide them. The Holy Spirit will be their teacher and will speak to them just as he did when he was alive and with them. The Holy Spirit will show the disciples what they must do and what they must say in Jesus' name.

There is only one God, But God is made up of three persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is what we call the Trinity. Trinity means three. This relationship of the Father, Son and Spirit is a relationship where all are together but each person is also different. The Father created the world and everything in it and sent his only Son Jesus to live among us here on earth. Jesus came to help us to know the Father, to teach us how to live and to forgive our sins. When he returned to heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit to give us courage, to guide us in the right path and to bring us faith, hope, joy and peace.

We believe that Jesus' promise to the disciples - that the Holy Spirit would be with them and guide them, is still true for all of us today and all people after us. The Holy Spirit can guide us to do what is right and to use our talents in the best way to help others.



Listen to the Holy Spirit in the coming week, and see how the Spirit guides you, especially in the way you treat those you live with and the members of our community and global family throughout the world?

Loving God, you are with us always. Send us your Spirit to teach and guide us to live in peace with each other every day. Amen.
