

Thank you to all of our girls who represented us with such grace and integrity, you really did us proud!






Mr G's Recommended Reads

For our younger readers...


'The Night Dragon' by Naomi Haw



The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Jesus, you come to us as bread and wine. Fill us with your kindness and give us the appetite and strength to change the world for the better.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear how Jesus performed a great miracle with bread for five thousand people.

Gospel: Luke 9:11-17

Jesus welcomed the crowds, spoke to them about the Kingdom of God, and healed those who needed it. When the sun was beginning to set, the twelve disciples came to him and said, "Send the people away so that they can go to the villages and farms around here and find food and lodging, because this is a lonely place." But Jesus said to them, "You yourselves give them something to eat."

They answered, "All we have are five loaves and two fish. Do you want us to go and buy food for this whole crowd?" (There were about 5,000 men there.)

Jesus said to his disciples, "Make the people sit down in groups of about fifty each."

After the disciples had done so, Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up to heaven, thanked God for them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to distribute to the people. They all ate and had enough, and the disciples took up twelve baskets of what was left over.

After a long day listening to Jesus, the disciples wanted to send the crowd away to find food and shelter. But Jesus said that the disciples had to feed the people themselves. However, through God's grace, everyone, all 5000 people, were able to eat the bread and the fish, and there was plenty left over, twelve baskets full! This miracle is the only miracle found in all four Gospels, apart from the miracle of the resurrection, and so it is a really important event. It is an illustration of God's power and shows us that as disciples of Christ, we will always be spiritual nourishment.

Today this story also has meaning because we are living in a time of soaring food prices. This is forcing many families in to poverty and making many people struggle to afford to buy the food that they need. In these times of difficulty, we must remember that Jesus is always there for us; we know that his love for us is endless and can take comfort from that knowledge.



Jesus, you fed the hungry crowds. Open our eyes to the needs of others and help us to follow your example of love and service. Amen.
