# Geography 2021-2022

This year we have implemented an exciting new scheme of work for Geography. The Primary Knowledge Curriculum offers our pupils a knowledge rich curriculum that is well sequenced to ensure children are given the opportunity to build on previous learning. This not only provides important building blocks for children's knowledge in Geography but also develops their retrieval skills. Both teachers and pupils at St John's are finding that the knowledge this curriculum provides generates further questions and curiosity about our world and the importance of protecting and caring for it.

With the new curriculum came new knowledge organisers. These gather the core, factual information for each unit taught ensuring that children can easily access, digest and remember powerful knowledge.

Our Geography lessons follow a clear structure, beginning with 'prior learning'. This is an opportunity for children to reconnect to prior learning and develop retrieval skills. Next is 'vocabulary'. Here children are exposed to new vocabulary that will be used in the lesson. Following this the children are taught the content of the lesson and are then given a 'talk task' to discuss before moving on to their main activity where they can apply what they have learned.



#### **Impact**

Assessment takes place at the end of each unit taught so

that progress can be measured. The impact since the implementation of the Primary Knowledge Curriculum has been very positive. This is reflected in the feedback children have given.

## Pupil Learning and Feedback

Since the introduction of the Primary Knowledge Curriculum pupils have been very positive in their responses when asked about their learning in Geography. Here's what they have to say:
