








Our eCadets delivered a fantastic session on what internet safety is all about. The children 'got talking!'




Our Pope's Prayer Intentions



There is a wonder and magic to childhood. We don't realize it at the time, of course . . . yet the adults in our lives do. They encourage us to see things in the stars, to find joy in colours and laughter as we play.

But what happens when that special someone who encourages such wonder and magic is no longer around? We can hide, we can place our heart in a bottle and grow up . . . or we can find another special someone who understands the magic. And we can encourage them to see things in the stars, find joy among colours and laughter as they play.



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Loving God, when we do wrong and hurt others help us to be brave and say sorry. Help us to all live in peace together.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

"I tell you, then, that you will be able to enter the Kingdom of heaven only if you are more faithful than the teachers of the Law and the Pharisees in doing what God requires.

"You have heard that people were told in the past, 'Do not commit murder; anyone who does will be brought to trial.' But now I tell you: whoever is angry with his brother will be brought to trial, whoever calls his brother 'You good-for-nothing!' will be brought before the Council, and whoever calls his brother a worthless fool will be in danger of going to the fire of hell. So if you are about to offer your gift to God at the altar and there you remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar, go at once and make peace with your brother, and then come back to offer your gift to God.

"You have also heard that people were told in the past, 'Do not break your promise, but do what you have vowed to the Lord to do.' But now I tell you: do not use any vow when you make a promise. Do not swear by heaven, for it is God's throne;

"Just say 'Yes' or 'No' – anything else you say comes from the Evil One."

In this story Jesus tells us that we must try hard not to get angry with our sisters and brothers or call them names. If we do argue with them, we must try to make it up with them and become friends again as soon as possible.

We are all part of God's family. All people are our sisters and brothers and God asks us to try to treat them as we want to be treated.

Sometimes people spend too much time thinking about the differences between us, rather than seeing that we are all part of the same global family. This can lead to arguments and problems. In some cases, it can lead to war or fighting between countries which means that people get hurt and have to leave their homes.

We are all different but we all have our own special gifts. We can use our special gifts to work together to make the world a fairer place for everyone rather than fighting with people who are different.



This week, can you try not to argue with or hurt anyone? How will you try to make peace with others this week?

God of mercy and peace, forgive us when we get angry with others and help us to make our peace with them so that we can all work together to make a better world.
