


Class Activities - KS2

RESTRICTION

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? NGL (which stands for 'Not Gonna Lie') is an app through which users share a link to their Instagram story or Twitter account, inviting their followers to give anonymous feedback. The app include some prewritten questions (such as 'if you could change anything about me, what would it be?'), plus the option to ask followers to simply 'send me anonymous messages'. All replies go into the user's NGL inbox, with the sender remaining anonymous — although subscribers to the app can receive hints about who each message was from.

We pray for those who have suffered harm from members of the Church; may they find within the Church herself a concrete response to their pain and suffering.




Mr G's Recommended Reads

For our younger readers...


'Rocket Rules' by Nathan Bryon and Dapo Adeola

Second Sunday of Lent

God of light and power, you sent your Son Jesus to show us how to live our lives. Help us to recognise him in all people that we meet and to take action so that the lives of all people may change for the better.

In this Sunday's gospel, we hear about something very special that happened to Jesus while he was on a mountain with three of his friends. His appearance changed as his face and clothes shone like the sun. This also changed the lives of his friends as they realised that Jesus was the Son of God. We can change people's lives through our actions, let's think about how today.

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

Six days later Jesus took with him Peter and the brothers James and John and led them up a high mountain where they were alone. As they looked on, a change came over Jesus: his face was shining like the sun, and his clothes were dazzling white. Then the three disciples saw Moses and Elijah talking with Jesus. So Peter spoke up and said to Jesus, "Lord, how good it is that we are here! If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

While he was talking, a shining cloud came over them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased—listen to him!"

When the disciples heard the voice, they were so terrified that they threw themselves face downwards on the ground. Jesus came to them and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid!" So they looked up and saw no one there but Jesus.

As they came down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Don't tell anyone about this vision you have seen until the Son of Man has been raised from death."

The disciples' lives were changed by what happened on the mountain. They now knew just how special Jesus really was – that he is God's Son.

Our lives are changed by Jesus too. Jesus lives in all of us. He asks us to always try to do what is right, to stand up for what we believe in and to help other people. Jesus calls us to show God's love to others.

Our love for one another can also shine out like the sun, as we treat all people as we would like to be treated by others.

What will you do this Lent to listen to God and to make sure your love for other people shines out too?



God of love, help us to be like your Son, and make a real difference to the lives of our global family. Amen.
