# Geography 2022-2023

This year we have continued to implement the Primary Knowledge Curriculum in Geography. This knowledge rich curriculum is providing our pupils with the opportunity to really embed what they have been learning. This is done through the well-sequenced scheme of learning designed to build on the children's prior knowledge as well as through carefully planned retrieval tasks at the start of lessons and for homework. Our pupil's are developing a greater understanding of the physical world we live in through our Spatial Sense units. They show an eagerness to develop their locational knowledge which is supported with the use of atlases, globes, maps and digital maps. Their curiosity to learn about the world, continents, countries and cities supports the development of their geography knowledge and skills. Children are also able to express their opinions, about current issues in society and the environment.

### **Impact**

Assessment takes place continuously during each Geography unit through various retrieval tasks and activities. The impact since the implementation of the Primary Knowledge Curriculum continues to be very positive. This is reflected in the feedback children have given.
