

PSHE Subject Leader Report - 2022-23

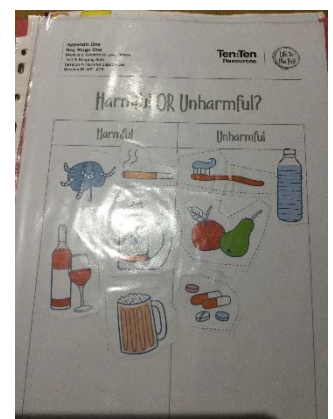
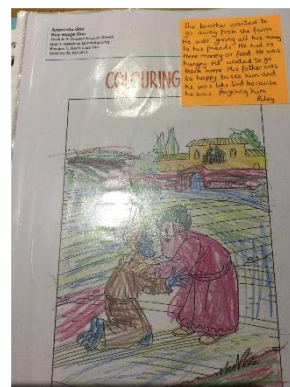
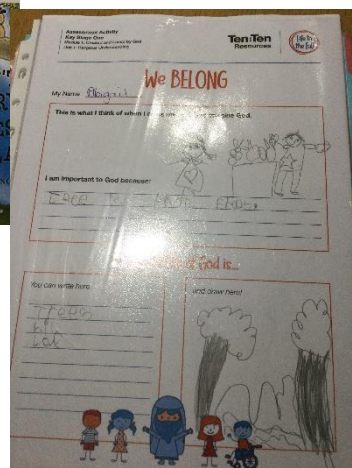
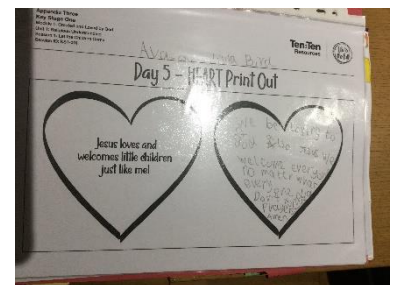


In PSHE this year, children have enjoyed following the Ten Ten Life to the Full Plus curriculum covering the topics: Religious Understanding; Me, My Body, My Health; Emotional Well-Being; Life Cycle; Personal Relationships; Life Online; Keeping Safe and Living in the Wider World. Within these units, sessions cover; Transitions, Rights and Responsibilities, Careers, Money, Online Safety, Drugs, Alcohol, Tobacco and Gender Identity. These lessons involve circle time, discussions and group work. The detailed videos in each session support the children's understanding. Evidence of work has shown all classes have done some work in all units.

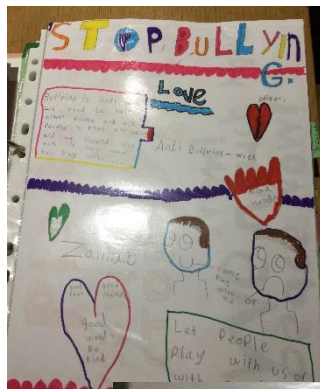
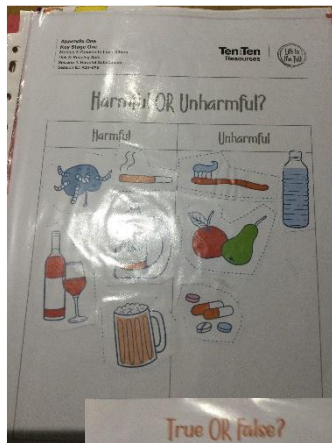

Early Years have continued to follow the Jigsaw programme as it is more appropriate for their age.

We have continued with the KiVa anti-bullying programme in KS2 whereby all classes have lessons developing their teamwork skills and how to support each other if they feel that bullying is taking place. Children learn to not be a bystander but to tell an adult if they see something wrong happening. Our KiVa trained anti-bullying team are always available for anyone who is concerned about bullying.



We took part in the national anti-bullying week with the theme of '#ReachOut' and based many activities on this. Our School Council discussed bullying and signed a charter for action to say that bullying is not tolerated in our school. In assembly, we learned about how it is important to think about our actions so we can change any negative behaviour and prevent bullying from happening.



Throughout the year, the School Council, who were elected by their class, have met regularly to share ideas on how to improve our school. During Pupil Voice Week, our Head Boy and Head Girl led their first assembly to share the many ways that children can discuss their feelings, offer their opinions and use their voice in positive ways. They shared the belief that we all have a voice in the world and we should use it to be positive and if we have a strong belief or opinion, we should share it with confidence.

Throughout the year we have raised lots of money for different charities including Race for Life and the NSPCC. KSI sold tip tops to raise money to buy world gifts. Made links with a local Residential Care Home for the Elderly. Showing care, kindness, compassion and love to ours, through giving time to listen and talk, giving prayer cards, chocolates and cards to the care home and local schools. We also had a Harvest food collection for our local food bank and were gifted overstocked and donated food from Tesco. Hampers were created for a family to receive in every class. Our school also took part in raising money to support the CAFOD Turkey-Syria Earthquake Appeal.

Know that Lent is a special season which starts during half term, when we try to follow Jesus more closely by listening to his words and learning from his actions. Be able to reflect on the words and actions of Jesus and apply them to real-life situations.



We have held many events for our school and wider community, including our Harvest assembly and our whole school Christmas lunch. Parents were invited to our Fairtrade Fortnight information displays. We have also set up our school's 'Uniform Recycle Shop.' Supporting those needing help with uniforms has been a great success. Several parent workshops have taken place throughout the year in different year groups.

Villa Football Centre worked with the Social Action Team. Working together to find solutions to save energy and other items through repurposing,

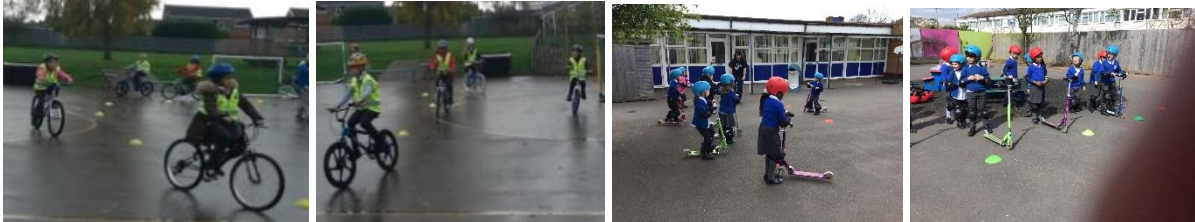
recycling, refusing and reusing. The Social Action Team discusses what they have learned and suggests solutions such as reintroducing the salad bar to help stop waste and hunger.
